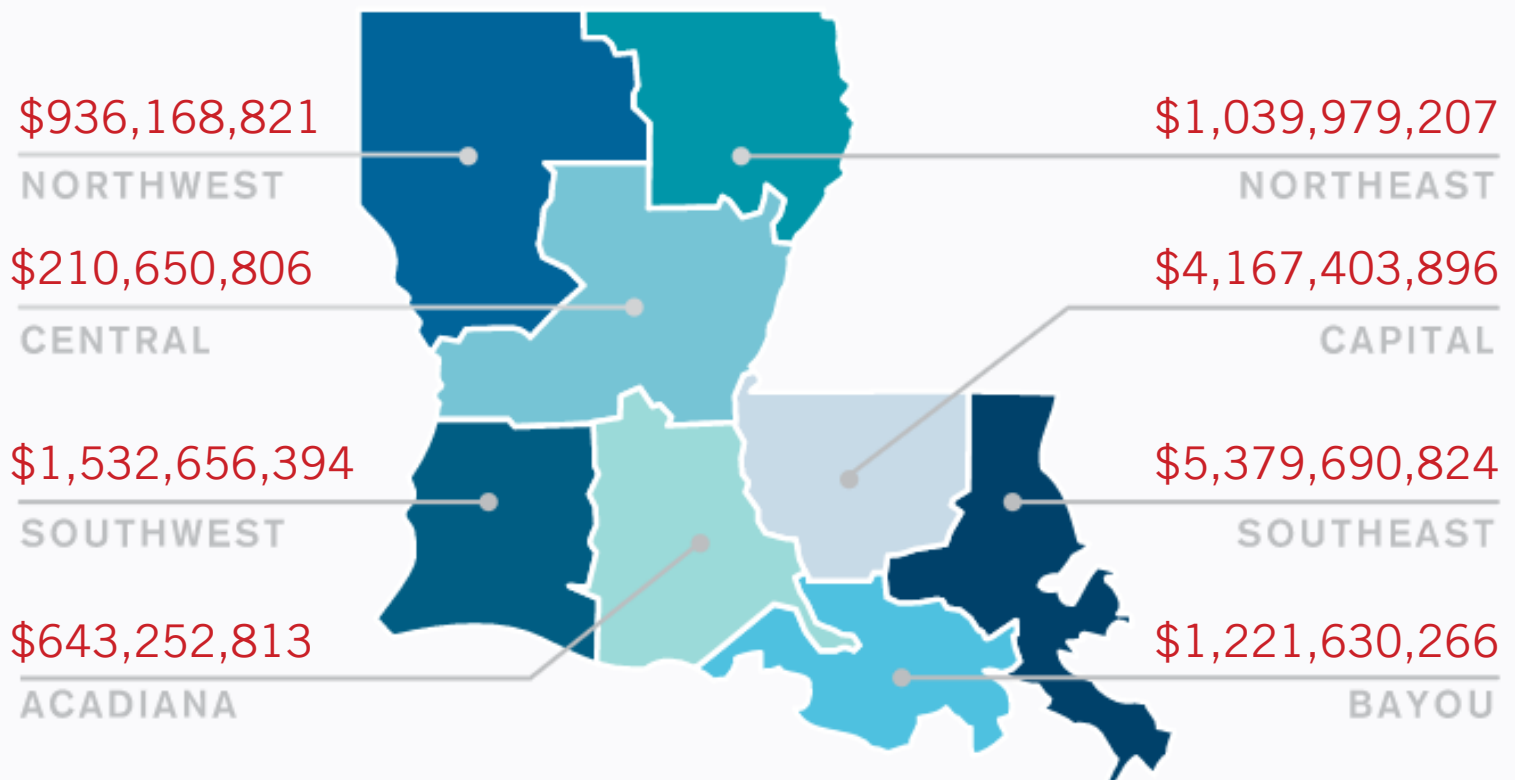


WORKING & WINNING TO BRING LOUISIANA'S TAX DOLLARS HOME

Acadiana Louisiana Key 3 Federal Dollars Secured

Award a \$125,000,000 design-build contract to elevate structures in the 25-year flood plain in Calcasieu, Cameron, and Vermilion Parishes.

\$85,000,000 to complete the Charenton Floodgate and construct priority levee enlargements, seepage remediation, and floodwall stability upgrades for Bayou Larose, Alabama Bayou, W121, E-73.3–E74, E-52, E-58, W-124, and W-99.

\$23,924,985 HHS ACF grant to St. Mary Community Action Agency to support Head Start programs in St. Mary and Vermilion Parishes.

Central Louisiana Key 3 Federal Dollars Secured

\$17,253,272 to rehabilitate the Texas Street Business Corridor from the Highway 1 South Bypass to Washington Street.

\$3,014,539 for the City of Alexandria to repair citywide electrical system damage from Hurricane Laura.

\$1,002,651 for Natchitoches to remove and replace damaged infrastructure from Hurricane Laura.



Northwest Louisiana Key 3 Federal Dollars Secured

\$18,000,000 supported major construction and modernization of nuclear mission infrastructure and housing improvements at Barksdale Air Force Base.

\$22,164,000 was used to construct roadway and intersection improvements along the 1.6-mile healthcare corridor at the nexus of I-49 and I-20 in Shreveport.

\$500,000 to support planning for the I-20 Corridor Intercity Passenger Rail Service, connecting Shreveport, Ruston, and Monroe to Dallas, TX.

Capital Louisiana Key 3 Federal Dollars Secured

\$20,000,000 is supporting construction of the Baton Rouge Train Station and Gonzales Train Station for the planned Baton Rouge–New Orleans Inter-City Rail Service.

\$16,940,807 grant to the YWCA of Greater Baton Rouge for Early Head Start continuation.

\$6,000,000 in federal funding to help the Capital Region recover from the 2016 flooding.



Bayou Louisiana Key 3 Federal Dollars Secured

\$34,532,561 FEMA grant to the Lafourche Parish School Board for Hurricane Ida disaster relief.

\$17,992,498 in federal funding for permanent Hurricane Ida repairs in Terrebonne Parish.

\$50,332,228 grant provided federal funding to the Lafourche Parish Hospital Service main hospital facility for damages as a result of Hurricane Ida.

Northeast Louisiana Key 3 Federal Dollars Secured

\$17,191,530 DOT BUILD Grant for the Monroe Street Corridor Project.

\$650,000 in federal grants for Teche Action Board to expand healthcare access in underserved communities.

\$500,000 to support planning for the I-20 Corridor Intercity Passenger Rail Service, connecting Shreveport, Ruston, and Monroe to Dallas, TX.

Southwest Louisiana Key 3 Federal Dollars Secured

\$150,000,000 secured from the infrastructure bill to help replace the I-10 Calcasieu River Bridge in Lake Charles.

\$142,490,758 in federal funding for transmission line repairs resulting from Hurricane Laura.

\$125,000,000 to award a design-build contract to elevate structures in the 25-year flood plain in Calcasieu, Cameron, and Vermilion Parishes in southwest Louisiana.

Southeast Louisiana Key 3 Federal Dollars Secured

\$783,000,000 to upgrade Plaquemines Parish east and west bank levee systems to the 50-year Level of Risk Reduction (LORR).

\$760,000,000 for West Shore Lake Pontchartrain as part of the U.S. Army Corps' \$1.388 billion allocation for Louisiana flood mitigation.

\$1,496,685 in federal funding for emergency sanitary system pumping and temporary lift-station support during Hurricane Francine.
